Voters

Global Strategy Group conducted an online survey of 1,212 likely 2024 General Election voters in U.S. House of Representatives battleground districts between August 22nd and August 28th, 2024.

Confidence interval

The confidence interval at the 95% confidence level is +/- 2.8% for the overall sample.

The margin of error on sub-samples is greater.



Key Findings

- Most battleground voters are familiar with and have deep disdain for Project 2025. And it is not just
 Democratic base voters driving animosity—a plurality of swing voters hold negative views of Project 2025
 as well.
- Voters describe Project 2025 as extreme and taking the country backwards. When voters think about Project 2025, they are most worried about a loss of rights—particularly abortion rights—and unchecked power for Trump.
- Not only do voters closely connect Trump and Project 2025 ignoring Trump's efforts to distance himself –
 voters also believe Trump supports most of the policies within Project 2025. Voters also closely associate
 Republicans in Congress with Project 2025 and believe Republicans support and will impliement the
 policies of Project 2025.
- Importantly, there is clear political benefit to talking about Project 2025: In battleground House Districts, a
 generic Democrat has a 4-point lead over a generic Republican candidate for Congress, but when the
 choice is between an anti-Project 2025 Democrat and a pro-Project 2025 Republican, the Democratic lead
 increases by 14 points, to an 18-point advantage for Democrats.
 - o Among those familiar with Project 2025, 64% report that it makes them less likely to vote for a candidate who supports it, and a 52% majority says it makes them *much* less likely.
 - Information about Project 2025 does a better job of motivating Democratic voters to turnout than traditional negative messages about Republicans.

Project 2025 has the potential to persuade less engaged voters and moderate Republicans, and motivate younger voters and non-liberal **Democrats**








Harris leads in Battleground Districts; Vance is especially unpopular among Swing voters




While swing voters are dissatisfied with both parties, MAGA Republicans present an opportunity to tip the balance in our favor



21% of self-identified Republicans are unfavorable to MAGA Republicans. These voters are less likely than their MAGA-friendly counterparts to be favorable to Republicans in Congress (+14 favorability compared to +77 fav). They are overwhelmingly unfavorable to Democrats in Congress (-79 favorability), but less so than their MAGA-friendly counterparts (-93 fav)

While half the electorate is familiar with and holds unfavorable views toward Project 2025; almost no one knows what Agenda 47 is

Favorability of Project 2025 and Associated Groups




Among self-identified Republicans who are unfavorable to MAGA Republicans (21%), Project 2025 is deeply underwater (8% favorable/57% unfavorable/-49 net favorable). The Heritage Foundation is disliked, though to a lesser degree (20% favorable/28% unfavorable/-8 net favorable.) Only 20% of these voters are familiar with Agenda 47.




Even among Trump friendly groups, voters hold negative views toward Project 2025, with strong intensity








Majorities of Americans oppose Project 2025 and believe it will harm people like them

Do you support or oppose the policies and ideas of Project 2025?




If it were implemented, what impact do you think Project 2025 would have on people like you?







Across key groups, voters believe Project 2025 will move the country backwards and limit our freedoms





How closely do you associate Project 2025 with Donald Trump?*




What do you think former President Trump believes about the policies and ideas of Project 2025?*




What do you think Republicans in Congress believe about the policies and ideas of Project 2025?*








Electoral Impact of Project 2025



Project 2025 boosts support overall for the Dem in the generic vote, but negatively impacts support among some key groups








Project 2025-infused messaging is narrowly more effective than traditional anti-GOP messaging in shifting voters

Vote Progression Among **Traditional** Anti-GOP Attack Recipients




For Democrats, Project 2025 messaging is more motivating to vote than traditional anti-GOP messaging; no risk of driving GOP turnout



The share of motivation targets who indicated they were *extremely* motivated to vote **increased by 27**% after receiving Project 2025 messaging (compared to a 21% increase among those who didn't hear Project 2025 messages).

The threat of a Republican candidate joining other Reps in Congress to pass Project 2025 is more concerning than the candidate's own policies - especially among motivation targets

Conclusions and Recommendations

- Continue to hammer on Project 2025. It is already well known across battleground districts and deeply disturbing to voters. Most describe it as extreme and taking our country backwards. Voters are most worried about losing rights and seeing Trump in office with unprecedented power.
- While Trump can try and distance himself all he wants—it's too late; the damage is done and will continue to deepen with sustained communications. Without prompting—voters tie Trump to Project 2025. And when asked, most believe he supports Project 2025 policies and will implement them if elected. Again, it's the unprecedented power transfer to Trump that scares voters the most. Notably, almost no one has heard of Agenda 47.



Conclusions and Recommendations

- Project 2025 is clearly a political liability for Republicans in Battleground congressional districts. Not only does infusing Project 2025 into messaging help increase the margin on top of more traditional anti-GOP messaging in Battleground Districts, but Project 2025 framing has additive value when it comes to motivating Democrats and engaging otherwise unengaged voters.
- While some messages work better in a Project 2025 frame than others, messages about democracy, especially, resonate— while "threats to democracy" can seem abstract and theoretical to voters, Project 2025 contextualizes what Trump would do in terms voters find credible and concerning. When talking about Project 2025 and democracy, we recommend focusing on Trump's unchecked power to fire thousands of non-partisan civil servants and military personnel and replace them with Trump loyalists.

Recommended language for a Project 2025 Democracy Message

[Republican candidate] will help push through Project 2025, which would give President Trump unchecked legal power. The plan makes Trump even more dangerous in a second term by granting him presidential powers like no president before, like authorizing the president to fire thousands of non-partisan civil servants and military personnel and replace them with Trump loyalists. Every IRS agent and military official would be hired specifically to implement Trump's will and serve retribution on his enemies.
